

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (Including Athletics)

The Sheridan County School District One Board believes that extra-curricular activities constitute an integral part of the total school program. The Board believes that students will benefit by participating in a wide variety of opportunities that allow them to grow physically, socially, and intellectually. Although differing in nature from the academic program, interscholastic athletics and extra-curricular activities are encouraged when they provide a profitable learning experience and are conducted with the best interests of participants as one of the primary considerations. Activities will be conducted in a manner that does not detract from the overall educational program.

It is the Board's policy to provide opportunities for all students enrolled in the District to participate in extra-curricular activities. In light of this, supervisors, coaches, and activity sponsors shall provide maximum opportunities for students to participate. In team activities, efforts should be made to allow all students to participate to the greatest extent possible. Qualified personnel will be provided for coaching and supervising of approved activities. All head and assistant coaches are required to have a current CPR/First Aid certification card on file at the district office prior to the beginning of the school year in which they intend to coach.

Participants and coaches will adhere to the parameters set forth by Board policies and regulations. When applicable, they will also adhere to the rules, regulations, and limitations outlined by the Wyoming High School Activities Association (WHSAA).
