

STUDENT EXEMPTIONS FROM REQUIRED INSTRUCTION

If the religious belief or teachings of a student or his/her parents or guardian are in conflict with the content of a school subject, or to any part of a school activity, the student may be exempt from participation. To receive an exemption, the parent or guardian must request an exemption from the principal, stating the conflict that is involved.

If a student is physically unable to participate in a physical education class he/she may present a statement from a physician stating the reason for the student's inability to participate. The statement or request for exemption will be presented to the principal for approval.

Exemptions from required instruction for religious or physical reasons will not excuse a pupil from the total number of credits, proficiency levels, or course requirements for graduation.
