The Governing Board met in Closed Session on Wednesday, October 7, 2020, from 6:01 PM to 8:00 PM. President Kimberly Hines reported the following action taken:

3. COMMUNICATIONS

a. Public Comments

Breanna Lafontaine, Financial Advisory Committee member, shared her family experience with remote learning and expressed her support for teachers' raise.

Abby Foster, CUSD teacher, talked to the Board about her experience teaching remotely. Ms. Foster said she appreciates the district's efforts to keep everybody safe and asked the Board to prioritize teachers' compensation.

b. Employee Organizations Report

1. CUTA Representatives

CUTA Co-President Sean Riordan said he believes the negotiation process can work and that a bargain can be agreed to accommodate both positions. Mr. Riordan said the CUSD and CUTA negotiating teams met in August to work on the MOU for remote learning and made changes necessary to implement instruction. Mr. Riordan said this MOU does not include payment compensation.

2. CSEA Representatives

CSEA President Stig Lynne asked the community to support Proposition 15 as a funding initiative for public education. Mr. Lynne congratulated Connie Giebelhausen on her retirement, and he also thanked Mayra Rodriguez and Tino Torres for their years of services to the district.

c. Board Members Report

Member Sophia Layne said the pandemic had added challenges, and it is important to take care of each other and our students. Ms. Layne also said it is important to make sure that decisions are based on evidence and context across all roles. Ms. Layne noted that in honor of Hispanic History Month, CUSD held their first meeting of a new Latinx Advisory Roundtable, and she said she is happy to support it.

Member Mary Beth Alexander shared she started a Masters in Governance course and had her first class where some statistics were shared, including that a Board talks about facilities and finance 60 percent of the time and about studying learning and achievement only 10 percent of the time. She shared a report that showed how high achieving boards talk about a focus on instruction. Ms. Alexander cited The Lighthouse Study that investigated student achievement in relation to Board expectations.

Member Freya McCamant said she values the work teachers do to be prepared and support the students. Ms. McCamant said she believes teachers are not paid enough and that if there is any money, a valuable

thing to do is honor them in that way. Lastly, Ms. McCamant said she will meet with Superintendent McPhetridge to move forward with the Environmental Committee formation.

Member Lizet Cortes said it is important to acknowledge and remember, in tribute to Hispanic Heritage Month, the minority group that has become the largest minority group in the US and also our district, noting how as a group they have been making remarkable contributions to this country. Ms. Cortez asked to move from an acknowledgment phase to an action phase by adopting a rich and robust curriculum to learn more about students' roots and history.

President Kimberly Hines said that everyone has their eyes on the future and a better district while in the pandemic. Ms. Hines also said she is interested in working with Assistant Superintendent Bhatia on the Visual and Performing Arts Committee that was put aside to prepare for back to school and to work on what is needed to make schools safer for teachers and students when they to go back to in-class instruction in a hybrid model.

d. Student Board Representative Report

Student Board Representative Caroline Dodge provided the Board and the public an update on Kings Mountain Elementary, Hatch Elementary, La Costa, Farallone View Elementary, and Cunha Intermediate School's events and activities.

e. Superintendent Report

Superintendent Dr. Sean McPhetridge said CUSD and CUTA leadership have been able to keep open lines of communication. Dr. McPhetridge said that the goal of negotiations is to find an agreement, and he is optimistic this will be resolved through the impasse process. Dr. McPhetridge also said the district also has to do their due diligence and provide data to the negotiations table and public about the data on affordability of new expenses, and CUSD continues working with CUTA until we have an agreement.

Dr. McPhetridge said that the safety, health, and emotional wellness of students, families, staff, and the community are very important, and he said he understands teachers and families alike want to return to in-class instruction as it is difficult to prepare young students for college and career remotely.
