

Co-curricular Program

The co-curricular program as defined consists of:

1. Activities that have been approved as part of the associated student body program; and
2. Other activities which are either directly or indirectly related to the curriculum and are not part of the associated student body program and which satisfy the conditions and criteria established in policy #2150.

Activities which operate as an approved associated student body program must have met all conditions as specified in the ASB Constitution. The school Principal and his/her designee shall be responsible for assigning a staff member(s) to supervise all such approved programs.

When an activity does not satisfy the ASB program conditions or ASB status would not be necessary or beneficial, interested students, and a proposed staff member-sponsor may seek approval and recognition as a co-curricular activity from the school Principal or his/her designee. Each approved group shall operate under the guidelines set forth by the Principal or his/her designee, including, but not limited to, objectives, membership, supervision, proposed activities, and funding.

Recognized groups shall have the use of school facilities and equipment under terms set forth by the school Principal or his/her designee. Groups that are not recognized as a part of the co-curricular program may apply for use of school facilities under conditions set forth in Policy 4330, Use of School Facilities, or Policy 2153, the Equal Access Policy for Noncurriculum-Related Student Groups, for activities that are not sponsored by the School District.
