“What is School-Wide PBIS?”

- ◆ An operational framework for achieving positive behavior
- ◆ A decision making framework
- ◆ A tool that guides selection, integration, and implementation of the best evidence-based academic and behavioral practices for improving important academic and behavior outcomes for all students.
- ◆ More importantly, SWPBIS is NOT a curriculum, intervention, or practice.

“What Outcomes are Associated with the Implementation of PBIS?”

- Less reactive, aversive, dangerous, and exclusionary, and
- More engaging, responsive, preventive, and productive
- Improved classroom management and disciplinary issues.
- Recognize students who are doing what is expected of them while at school.



Ask your students: **“Did you R.O.A.R. at school today?”**

“What Does School-Wide PBIS look Like at Pioneer Elementary?”

- ◆ Students are taught behavior expectations the first week of school.
- ◆ Recognize those who are meeting expectations.
- ◆ Students who make good choices are given “R.O.A.R.” cards .
- ◆ Students are also awarded R.O.A.R, certificates from their classroom teachers
- ◆ Students are recognized for their awards at the morning meetings.

Core Principles of PBIS

- 1. We can effectively teach appropriate behavior to all children.**
- 2. Intervene early.**
- 3. Use of a multi-tier model of service delivery.**
- 4. Use research-based, scientifically validated interventions to the extent available.**
- 5. Monitor student progress to inform interventions.**
- 6. Use data to make decisions.**
- 7. Use assessment for three different purposes.**
