Notes from the Counseling office

Scholarships are available throughout the entire school year, so start applying early in the year and continue to apply to every scholarship you think you qualify for throughout your entire senior year. Remember, you won't get scholarships if you don't take the time to apply!



Deadlines always come up quicker than you think, so apply early and pay close attention to all of the application requirements (many require official transcripts, letters of recommendation, or other documents that may take several days, or even weeks to get).
