

Superintendent-School Board Relations

The Board of Directors shall:

- Select the Superintendent and delegate to him/her all necessary administrative powers.
- Adopt Policies for the government of the school system.
- Provide direction for the educational program.
- Elect administrators, principals, and teachers upon recommendation of the superintendent.
- Approve collective bargaining agreements.
- Prescribe a course of study.
- Adopt textbooks and instructional materials.
- Require and consider periodic reports on the educational program.
- Approve the annual budget.
- Approve bills previously authorized.
- Require and approve effective plans for maintenance and operation of school properties.
- Plan necessary changes of school plant and facilities.
- Require annual report on District programs.
- Represent schools and their needs to the community and the state legislature.
- Require adequate inventory on school property and equipment.

The Superintendent shall:

- Be the chief executive officer of the District and with his/her administration shall:
- Develop and implement policies of the Board through appropriate administrative procedures and regulations;
- Give leadership in the continuing development, operations, supervision, and evaluation of the educational program;
- Recommend candidates for election as administrators, principals, and teachers;
- Negotiate collective bargaining agreements;
- Prepare and submit courses of study;
- Recommend textbooks and instructional materials;
- Prepare and present reports on the educational program as required;
- Prepare and submit the annual budget;
- Direct all purchases for the District;
- Administer programs of maintenance and operation of school properties;
- Prepare and present studies of continuing facilities needs;
- Provide annual report on District programs;
- Plan and prepare measures to keep the community and legislature informed; and
- Maintain a continuous inventory.
