Instructional Program Plan

Instructional Plan for 2021-2022

K-5 Instructional Model

- ▶ In-person instruction
- ▶ 5 days a week
- ▶ Regular schedule with Early Release Wednesdays
- ▶ Full instructional program - while following health department guidance
- ▶ Transportation provided for eligible students

Instructional Plan for 2021-2022

High School & Middle Schools Instructional Model

- ▶ In-person instruction
- ▶ 5 days a week
- ▶ 6-period schedule
- ▶ Regular schedule with Early Release Wednesdays
- ▶ Typical school instructional activities - while following health department guidance
- ▶ Transportation provided for eligible students

Instructional Plan for 2021-2022

Shoreline will explore

- ▶ Remote /online instruction via the PSESD online learning cooperative
- ▶ A student would remain enrolled as a Shoreline student

Instructional Plan for 2021-2022

Student Well-being

- ▶ Focus on meeting student social emotional needs and create a school and classroom environment where all students feel seen, heard, and valued
 - ▶ Training and resources for implementing Circles
 - ▶ SEL instructional components
 - ▶ Work with families to develop authentic partnerships
 - ▶ Partnership with Ryther for secondary schools

Instructional Plan for 2021-2022

Identifying student strengths and next steps in learning

- ▶ Circles and regular structures for knowing student stories
- ▶ Assessments in literacy and math
- ▶ Updated Pacing Guides

Safety Protocols & Operating Plans

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans

Priorities:

- ▶ Mitigating risks for in-person learning
- ▶ Meeting safety requirements issued by:
 - ▷ Department of Health,
 - ▷ Department of Labor and Industries,
 - ▷ OSPI, and
 - ▷ Other Federal/State agencies with jurisdiction

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Daily Safety Protocols

Campus presence:

- ▶ No parents, volunteers, or visitors on campus, at least for the beginning of the school year

Attestations/Sign-in procedures:

- ▶ No daily attestations required, however
- ▶ Continue sign-in for staff, daily attendance for students

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Vaccinations

Vaccinations:

- ▶ Not required of staff or students (as of the date of this presentation)
- ▶ Fully vaccinated students and staff must provide proof of vaccination status:
 - ▷ Copy of CDC vaccination card, or
 - ▷ Written confirmation from health care provider, or
 - ▷ State immunization system record
 - ▷ Personal attestation not acceptable for students, acceptable for staff in lieu of one of the above

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Daily Safety Protocols

Masks:

- ▶ All students must wear masks on campus and on buses
- ▶ All staff must wear masks whenever students are or may be present
- ▶ Fully vaccinated staff may remove masks when no students are present and staff are working in an enclosed space

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Daily Safety Protocols

Personal hygiene:

- ▶ Frequent hand washing or use of hand sanitizer
- ▶ Appropriate PPE will be provided to staff who are required to be within physical distance parameters of students

Testing:

- ▶ No on-site testing, but information will be provided for rapid nearby testing
- ▶ Watch for testing information for specific sports

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Daily Safety Protocols

Physical Distancing Requirements:

- ▶ 3-foot spacing between students, if possible, in classrooms
- ▶ 6-foot spacing between students, if possible, when students are unmasked while eating and when engaged in activities which cause increased exhalation (PE, music, recess)
- ▶ 6-foot spacing between adults, whenever possible

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Facilities

- ▶ Daily cleaning and disinfecting
- ▶ Emergency disinfecting as required

- ▶ Ventilation:
 - ▷ MERV13 filters were installed last spring and have been replaced just before the start of school
 - ▷ Increased airflow to meet CDC requirements

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Case Monitoring

Same protocols as last spring:

- ▶ Do not come to school/work if you are sick or have symptoms of the COVID-19 virus that are not otherwise explained (i.e., known allergies)
- ▶ Report to school principal if you have been exposed to or diagnosed with a positive case of COVID-19
 - ▶ As of today, fully vaccinated students and staff do not need to quarantine/isolate if exposed to positive case but no symptoms
- ▶ Positive cases and contact tracing information will be provided by the school district to Public Health-Seattle & King County

Safety Protocols and Operating Plans for 2021-2022: Case Monitoring

Same protocols as last spring:

- ▶ Schools/supervisors will communicate with families, faculty, site staff as needed when a positive case has been reported
- ▶ The District [website](#) will maintain a weekly and year-to-date summary of positive cases reported by school/site
